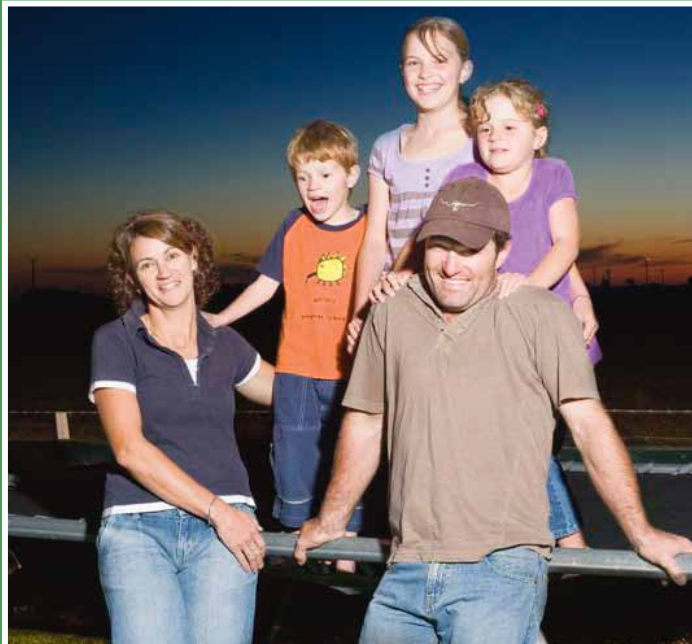

This past year's funding distribution benefited 20 diverse charities and projects, some of which the Governors had the opportunity to visit. It is always insightful and rewarding for the Governors to experience first-hand the impact of our funding on our beneficiaries.

It is my pleasure to introduce the third annual report of the Coopers Brewery Foundation, for the 2008/09 year.

The Foundation is our commitment, by Coopers Brewery, to the health and welfare of Australians, reflecting our sense of social responsibility.

In the three years since its inception, I am proud to announce that the Foundation has distributed \$513,368 to 45 worthy Australian charities.

Particularly pleasing to note this year was the increase in the Foundation's distribution of funds, to \$252,163. This increase was partly aided through the Foundation's inaugural charity golf day, which was held at Kooyonga Golf Club in May. The day was immensely successful, raising in excess of \$45,000 for the Ronald McDonald House Building Appeal. I wish to sincerely thank all the companies and individuals involved who generously contributed to make this day such a memorable and worthwhile event.

All of the Foundation's expenses are paid by Coopers Brewery Limited, thereby ensuring that all income received (ex GST), including brewery tour fees and public donations, is distributed directly to Australian charities.

A special mention and thank you is extended to the Foundation's donors and supporters, who are enthusiastic in their determination to provide assistance to worthy causes, and to disadvantaged Australians, particularly during these difficult economic times.

I also wish to thank the Foundation Governors for their support, time and commitment in helping to ensure the Foundation remains effective and relevant to charities and supporters alike.

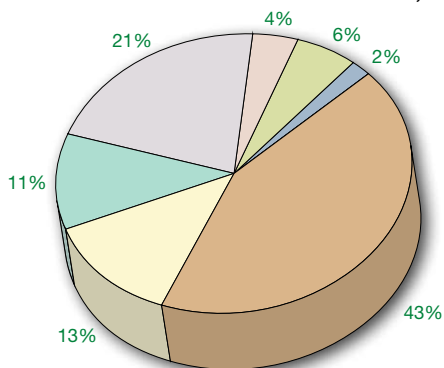

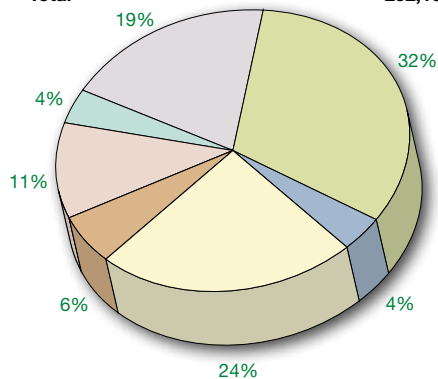
